This is Thanksgiving month, so let me wish each of you a Happy Thanksgiving. I personally have so much to be thankful for, including working with PFLAG and the LGBTQ community. For example, I just returned from the PFLAG National Convention held in Portland, Oregon. There were approximately 400 PFLAGer's in attendance. As I stood in the back and looked over the audience I had the same overwhelming feeling I had when I attended my first convention several years ago. The room was filled with all of these parents, many of them with grey hair, and they are there because they love and support their LGBTQ children and they want to learn more on how to be even more supportive to them individually and to the whole community. Prior to joining PFLAG, my social life certainly centered around other gay persons. I had no idea how many parents were out there fighting for our equal rights. I have some regrets that I did not come out to my parents until late in my adult life, because I think that they would have been ready to fight for me as well. I was very fortunate to have two loving parents who didn't judge me or others because of who we chose to love. And, yes, for that I am so very very thankful.

There were way too many workshops at the convention for me to cover here. However, one thing that I was reminded of, is that there is so much good information available on the internet for individuals and parents who are struggling with LGBT issues. The National PFLAG website has numerous resources, and I was surprised at how many good topics there are on LGBTQ issues on You Tube. If you haven't done a search on You Tube regarding any of the many LGBTQ issues lately, then try it. Yes, you will have some clips that are negative but there are certainly many more than are positive, educational, uplifting and heartwarming.

PFLAG New Orleans Scholarship Deadline: February 1, 2018

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS You must

1. Self identify as gay, lesbian, bisexual, transgender, queer...or anywhere within the LGBTQ "family."

- 2. Be a resident of the state of Louisiana at the time of application.
- 3. Be seventeen years old, or older, by April 15th of the award year.
- 4. Be applying to attend (or currently attending) a post-secondary educational institution.

PFLAG New Orleans Straight For Equality Scholarship Deadline for Nominations: January 15, 2018 Nominations are made by those who know students who are extraordinary allies to the LGBTQ community.

ELIGIBILITY REQUIREMENTS:

The nominee must meet the following criteria.

1. Identify as a straight ally of the LGBTQ+ community.

- 2. A resident of the state of Louisiana at the time of application.
- 3. Seventeen years old, or older, by April 15th of the award year.
- 4. Applying to attend (or currently attending) a post-secondary educational institution.

The application period for our 2018-2019 higher education scholarships opened November 1 and remains open until January 29, 2017.

Point Foundation (Point) empowers the next generation of lesbian, gay, bisexual, transgender and queer (LGBTQ) leaders to reach their full leadership and academic potential. Point provides its scholars with the financial ability to attend the higher education institution of their choice. In addition, Point provides mentorship, leadership development, and community service training. Students can apply if they will be enrolled in either a four-year undergraduate program, or a graduate program in the fall of 2018. Note: high school seniors who will begin college in the fall of 2018 are eligible. Applicants are evaluated on academic accomplishment, financial need, leadership within school and community, and goals for the future. Point Scholars agree to maintain a high level of academic performance and complete an annual community service project.
